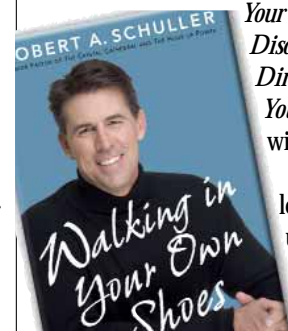

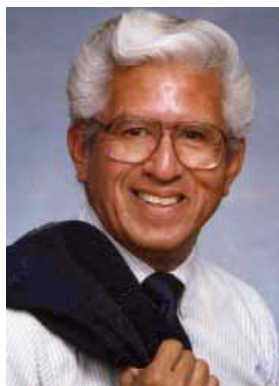

In one, as they processed down the center aisle, a woman jumped up and stopped Jess Tapia. “I know you,” she said. “I see you every Sunday. You’re my friend.” Another woman, a member of our church asked me one day if I knew the identity of that handsome man in the back row of the choir. I didn’t know then. Now I do.

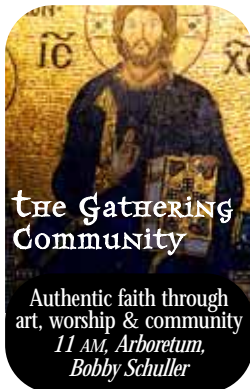

Famous Sculptor John Soderberg Wows the 50+ Crowd

takes a team of many strong and committed people to cut the original clay sculpture apart and then after bronzing each piece reassembling and coloring it in such an exacting way.

Day two of Soderberg's visit was truly a unique opportunity with twenty-five eager wannabe artists paying \$10 for the sculpting workshop, spending the day learning how to sculpt a face and human eye. The \$1,000-a-day teacher donated his time to patiently and lovingly teach a few rank amateurs how to sculpt with clay. One called it a "spiritual" experience. Every participant was so excited about their day that they all begged to have another day with the great man, and he agreed, and it will be scheduled!

Rhea Zakich, our awesome teacher for Women's Bible Study, and I have been having a blast praying about and preparing for Bible Study this fall. I know you will be blessed and want to be involved after reading the following interview between Rhea and me:

MC: Do you have any exciting plans for the year?

RZ: We'll be using the symbol of a NET because of the many uses of nets. Jesus told the disciples to be "fishers of men" (and I would add women). In order to catch fish, one may have to go 'way out' into the deep, or drop a net on a different side. I believe we are to reach out to others and draw them closer to Christ. That will be our NET WORK! And there are also safety nets to catch us when we fall.

MC: What is the difference between Women's NetWork and a traditional women's Bible study?

RZ: There is value in all types of Bible studies, but the new Women's NetWork will move beyond reading and discussing Bible passages to learning to apply spiritual principles in our everyday lives. It will be a relational Bible Study with time to discuss, experiment, and practice the things we are learning on this spiritual journey together.

MC: Why should women come to Women's NetWork?

RZ: I am convinced that our Christian faith grows best in a loving community, where no woman feels alone in her trials or transitions. The Women's NetWork will be an oasis in the middle of the week where we can relax, share our stories, and open ourselves for new understanding and inner healing.

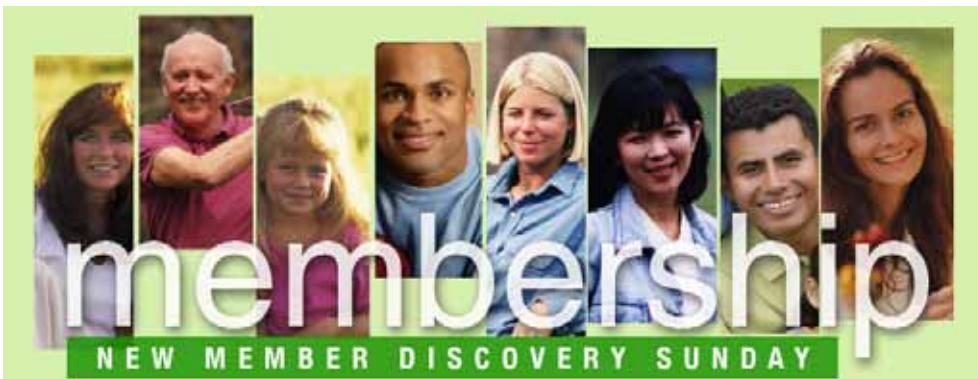
Books in Summer?

Counselor of the Month:

Carl Chavez

Carl Chavez is the kind of man that it just feels good to be with. He has a gentle and sincere spirit and a deep wisdom tucked away deep inside that he's too humble to share unless he's prodded a bit.

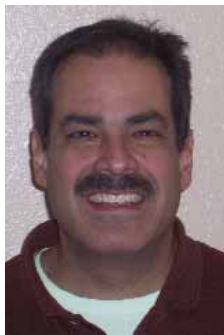
You'd have to get up very early on Saturday morning to meet Carl, a New Hope counselor who has served as a faithful Night Owl from 4 to 8 AM on Saturday mornings since 2003.

Why does he get up when the rest of us are sleeping to help bring the light of Christ to the hurting when the hours are the darkest? It was after getting the help he needed to deal with his own pain that Carl was inspired to reach out to others who were hurting. Initially, he thought that it'd be too much for him to be a counselor, but he stuck with the training. One of the things that really inspired him to finish were these lyrics by George Harrison: "Give me hope, help me cope with this heavy load."

In his late teens and early 20s, when Carl went through his own dark time, he recalls, "I kept trying to reach out to people, but I just couldn't connect." Eventually Carl received help from a Christian counselor and reassurance from his Savior: "Jesus was there to hear and to comfort me," Carl said.

Carl now loves just to "be there" to listen to someone else who is in pain, to give him or her comfort and help him or her to find hope in his or her situation. "Once you get into it, you realize that it's not that hard," he smiled, "but what an honor."

Carl sees himself as "an instrument of Christ" to encourage others as the Lord has encouraged him, which Paul talks about in 2 Corinthians 1:3-



7. In fact, this passage of Scripture is so deeply etched in Carl's heart and mind that he's used it as his user name for his service in the Crystal Cathedral's online Prayer Community.

Carl has had such a positive experience being a New Hope Counselor that last year he changed careers and left a stable job in accounting to work
