We have two specific areas where WE NEED YOUR SUPPORT:

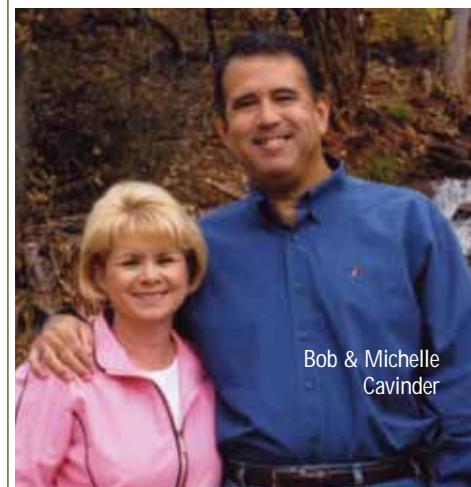

The Reality of Poverty in the O.C.

Living in Orange County is a blessing for all. However, for many families, it also poses a great challenge. Many families struggle with the high cost of living. Though they want to improve their family life standards and build a better future for their children, parents often feel trapped by their circumstances.



United Way of Orange County reports that:

- A child is born into poverty every two hours in O.C.
- Approximately 55% of O.C. renters (over 200,000 households) can't afford an average one-bedroom apartment.
- Over 22,000 of the 35,000 homeless in O.C. have jobs.

With economic worries in the news, families skipping meals to afford rent, and people on public transportation or riding bikes for lack of gas money or car insurance, one might pause to think, "I'm doing better than that. What can I do to help my neighbors in need?"

Crystal Cathedral Community Missions volunteers work out in the community with outreach programs to our neighbors, seeing first-hand what they are experiencing every day. When schools let out for summer soon and the children go without the school-provided breakfasts and lunches, we'll be there to help fill the need. Part of our summer program is providing peanut butter sandwiches at lunchtime and sending the children home with cans of tuna for their family's dinner. However, we can only do this with your help.

Robert Do Qui, Ministering Elder, 1934-2008

On February 9, 2008, word came to Pastor Bob Cavinder that longtime church member, Robert Do Qui, had peacefully, but unexpectedly, died in his chair while asleep. He was 74 years old.

Still active in his work as an actor, Robert was also still diligently and effectively serving as a Ministering Elder to the Crystal Cathedral congregation. He cared for the people assigned to him and others, as well. Often, since he lived near Los Angeles, he visited any Crystal Cathedral attendees who were in L.A.-located hospitals. Robert always said an automatic "yes" to any request, and blessed many by his willingness to reach out. On one occasion, when asked to officiate at the funeral of a woman whom he had visited as an Elder, Robert agreed and, though never officially trained in this specific area of ministry, was able to create and lead a beautiful and meaningful funeral service for her. Robert was a true friend, a reliable spiritual resource, and a natural-born leader.

While he always had a ready smile, Robert's life included many other facial expressions, as well - after all, he was an award-winning Hollywood actor for fifty years, and a member of the Screen Actors Guild. He was also a creative writer with prayers, stories, and poems available for you to read at www.robertdoqui.com.

We will miss Robert very much. His 92-year-old mother, four adult sons, and their wives and children survive him. We give thanks to God for this wonderful man who blessed so many.

How has Dot continued giving eight hours a month for seven years to answer calls from anonymous, hurting people? "I remember to pray that God will give me the calls that are meant for me."

Dot taught Home Economics for many years, enjoying the young people while teaching them basic life skills. Now, as a phone counselor, Dot especially enjoys it when God sends her calls from younger people who need her care and encouragement, or the lonely callers who just need someone to talk to. She's happy knowing that God is using her to make a real difference in people's lives just by opening up her heart to listen.

Dot has followed the example of her mother, Leila Sims, who had been a New Hope counselor for many years covering a midnight to 4 am shift. When her mother died, Dot joined New Hope to continue her mother's ministry, taking her phone name and being blessed to feel connected to her as she serves.

Dot and her husband raised their three kids at the Garden Grove Community Church, which became the Crystal Cathedral, and appreciated that they could attend the drive-in church when their kids were sick. Dot, who has seen the church grow and change, describes the night that the Tower of Hope was opened as a particularly special moment: "Everyone was gathered at the base of the tower. They held hands, prayed, and then the cross was lit for the first time!"

Since that time, because of wonderful volunteers like Dot and Leila, the lights in the Tower on the New Hope floor have remained lit as volunteers, around the clock, help the hurting find comfort and care.

kicked in the face by a horse, and lost an eye. That sent him to the farm, literally.

Norm was raised by a single parent - his dad! He was a wonderful man who, in grief, drifted into a life of itinerant laborer, like house painting. Though Norm lived in many different homes in his young life and was not nurtured spiritually, he was encouraged by his dad to get an education. When his dad bought Norm, then 14, the complete works of William Shakespeare, the boy read one play a day for thirty-seven days. He says "words" are his passion.

While Blanche was a responsible, positive church-going Christian her whole life, Norm had to find his own way. His dad was a non-practicing Mormon with basic Christian belief, but no inclination to nurture his kids' souls. Norm's personal inner spiritual hunger drove him to the church. He felt he needed something more and, on his own, he began attending a Baptist congregation. Later Blanche's pastor mentored Norm, which was meaningful and took him to the next step of his faith.

Blanche and Norm are first of all followers of Jesus. They have shown their goodness and godliness

make a difference for people who long to rise above the circumstances of life that keep them from experiencing satisfying, worthwhile, God-given, victorious lives. Together, we can be the hands of Jesus that lift a disabled person into a wheelchair for the first time, the caring teacher who breaks down the barriers that limit the lives of precious children of promise, the supplier of resources needed to provide clean drinking water to rural villagers and farmers across China.

Our goal is to raise \$1 million above that which covers normal operating expenses to fund seven key initiatives in the Chinese mainland in 2008. (See page 16 for initiative descriptions.) But we can't fulfill this dream alone - we need you. And, isn't that the way it's supposed to be...all of us, together, reaching out a loving hand in the name of Christ?

HOLDING ON...LETTING GO

Dear Dr. Sheila,

My mother was recently diagnosed with Alzheimer's. She still remembers my siblings and me, but sometimes gets the names of her grandchildren mixed up. I have already started grieving as I lose more of her each day. I feel so guilty about the time I lost with her in the past, caught up in furthering my career, not spending enough time with her. Now I feel like it's too late. Can you help?

—Too Little Too Late

Dear Not Too Late,

Although it may not feel like it right now, the truth is you have been given a great gift!

You have an opportunity to make the most of these last years with your mother. There are two suggestions I would offer you. The first one is practical; the second is spiritual.

1. Capture her now, while you still have time. Take pictures, videotape, record, journal — get her to talk about her life as much as you can. This will provide a way for you to stay as connected with her as possible. In the process, you will provide a gift for your children and your children's children, and give her the gift of you while she still knows you and recognizes you.

2. Put her in God's hands, for she is His child more than she is your mother. When my father was in the hospital in Amsterdam with a head injury that left him with no memory, my mother faced an uncertain future and cried out to God. Suddenly, she looked out the hospital window and saw a sparrow sitting on the ledge. Immediately the words to a familiar hymn came to mind: "Why should I feel discouraged...His eye is on the sparrow...and I know He watches me!"

Treasure the moments you have left with your mother, resting in the hope that she is in good hands — God's hands!
