



peace he'd ever known. It was short-lived, however, as a thought struck him about how his call into ministry might affect the family that was dependent upon him. But once he received encouragement from his family and accepted God's promise to take care of them, Ray's call returned full force, and he never looked back.

Rev Van Beek died on February 16 at the age of 87. During his working life, he had been a farmer, general store owner, Postmaster, milk truck driver, and more. He was forty years old when he took the step to serve in his final occupation, that of a pastor. He left everything behind to pack up his family and head for college and a life in Christian ministry.

Ray and Dorothy Van Beek and five children moved to Holland, Michigan, to Western Theological Seminary for the final years of preparation. It was difficult, but propelled and propped up by their vibrant faith and confidence in God, the Van Beeks thrived and finished the task.

Following seminary, Ray became pastor of a small rural church in northern Wisconsin. During twenty years with that church, Pastor Van Beek, with the Holy Spirit's leading, was instrumental in performing a miracle. A small church no one thought could survive turned into a thriving, growing congregation. During his tenure, the fifty-family, dying congregation in a small church became a booming 150-family church in a beautiful, spacious new building. Forestville Reformed Church became New Hope Community Church, located on a strategic new corner, attracting more and more people from the nearby city and farms.

After twenty years in that position, the Van



Beeks retired and moved to California where three of their five children had moved. But it was not to be retirement for long for a new ministry career was to begin in 1985 when Dr. Schuller soon asked Ray to join his pastoral team. Ray was asked to handle the most difficult of any pastoral position, the job of Minister to the State Prisons.

For at least a dozen years, this included weekly trips to Chino State Prison with a group of volunteers to lead a Bible Study. Then each fall, the biggest part of the job began - gearing up to package and deliver Christmas gift boxes for all the prisoners. That annual joy included recruiting, inspiring, and motivating our church members to bake more than 15,000 dozen chocolate chip cookies. Every box included a dozen of these homemade morsels, plus reading materials and stationery supplies. That was an enormous task, but Ray completed it every year, for 12 years.

Ray and Dorothy's family include five adult children. Two live in Eau Claire, Wisconsin, and three are Southern California residents. One, Dorinda, sings in our Cathedral Choir. Dorothy resides at Artesia Christian Home.

Ray's life was an interesting and productive one - he had tremendous success as pastor of a congregation and showed enormous strength in directing the Prison Ministry project. In addition, Ray was a music lover, a singer, and keyboard player. He was an athletic pitcher who excelled in fast-pitch softball. He was a man of God who admired, and identified with, the reluctant prophet Moses. He heard the Lord's call, responded with all his might, and used all his gifts, talents, and experience to leave the world a better place than when he arrived.

Times Never Last but Tough People Do) that were published in Chinese by the secular mainstream Chinese Press - we became recognized at the highest levels of the Chinese government.

While in China, I had the opportunity to give a lecture to the students at the University of Beijing, sharing with them my possibility thinking and self-esteem theology. Having to be very discreet about how I spoke about God and religion, I gave them eight words that I hoped they would remember and carry with them: "I am...I can...I will...I believe!"

The young Chinese students were very responsive to this positive message and riddled me with questions afterwards. Before I had time to answer all their questions, I was ushered out the door by the officials. As I stepped outdoors and looked up at the sky, this prayer ran through my mind: "Oh God, how the world needs Your message of possibility thinking and self-esteem: I am! I can! I will! I believe!"

That night in our hotel room, I said to Arvella, "Wow! The whole world needs our faith-filled message of possibility thinking. Young and old everywhere are hungry for it."


In 2006, Arvella and I went back to China at the invitation of the Chinese government. Doors were opening and old churches were being reopened after being closed since Mao came to power. Now, I have been invited by the highest government officials to return with our possibility thinking messages.

At the heart of possibility thinking is what Jesus told His followers: "If you have faith as a mustard seed, you will say to the mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you" (Matthew 17:20).

This is our ministry, based on possibility thinking, which inspires us into possibility doing. A world of possibilities wrapped in the love of Jesus Christ. Now that's a WOW!

as educators, on many levels. Blanche (M.A. in Education) has been a teacher for 25 years and a principal for 19 years in the Alta Loma public school district. After graduating from Anderson University in Indiana, she was recruited by California school officials, who needed her so badly that they paid her rent for three months.

Norm started, and finished, his career as a professional educator by also becoming an elementary school teacher. His first calling, he says, was to teach young children, and that is what he did for forty-seven years. Once he received a M.A. degree in English, he was recruited to teach English at

Anderson University. Eventually it was back to the public school system as a teacher and a principal. After receiving his doctorate (Ed.D.) from Ball State University, he made major contributions to educational theory and practice. As a professor for National University, for whom he still teaches, he authored Handbook for Writing Formal Papers and the soon-to-

be released Interactive Learning. Norm anticipates it will make an impact in the field of education.




