This Easter, be Blessed to Not See... Yet Believe!

Right around this time last year, a nine-year-old girl came up to me and asked what I was doing. “I’m reading a true story in the Bible about Easter,” I answered. When she heard the word “Easter,” she lit up and shared that at Easter she received gifts and lots of candy, but really didn’t know why.

I said, “Well, Easter is about a Man who so loved all of us, that He gave us the greatest gift of all. He was willing to die for us because He loved us so much.” Her eyes got wide.

“But then after three days, he came back to life again!” Her eyes opened even wider.



Then she asked me the age-old question of scholars, skeptics, and seekers: “But how do you know it’s true?”

My answer to the girl was the same as what I’ve shared with countless others who have asked the same question. I explained that four writers of the Bible said that they saw Jesus after He came back to life and that there

Our beloved Founding Pastor, Dr. Robert H. Schuller, will be presented with the Orange County Tourism Council’s prestigious Legacy Award at the upcoming Service Excellence Awards on April 10. The award recognizes lifetime contributions to visitor-serving businesses and organizations.

Dr. Schuller, the first pastor to receive the award, will be so honored for the unique role he has played in the developing face of Orange County and its cultural institutions since 1955 when he founded the world’s first walk-in/drive-in church. When he went on to build the spectacular Crystal Cathedral,

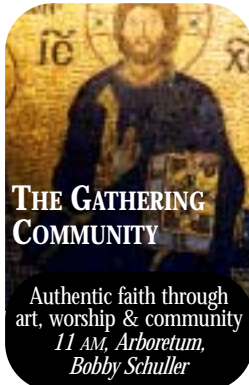

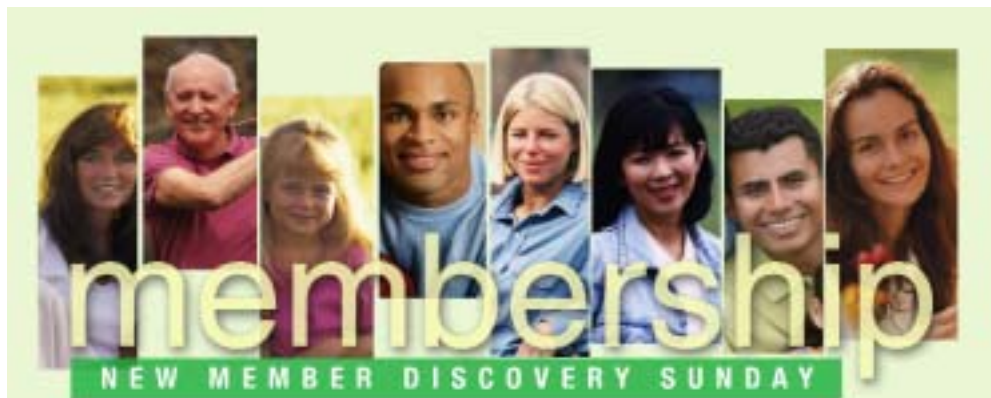
