TRUSTING IN GOD'S PERFECT PLAN

Dear Dr. Sheila,

My daughter is a remarkable violinist. When she plays, people with tears in their eyes tell me that her music moves them. The challenge is that she has suddenly quit playing! She says she needs time off. She is a senior in high school, and I am afraid that she will never play again. How can I convince her that she is making the mistake of a lifetime?

Loves Music

Dear Loves Music,

As a superintendent of a school for the arts, and as a mom of two musical sons, I can relate to your concerns. One of my sons excelled at cello and one at voice, and I made sure they had the best teachers. I loved listening to them play and sing.

When my son Scott quit cello, I experienced a real sense of loss. But I truly believed that, if the interest is really theirs and not ours, they will come back to it someday. During the four years Scott didn't play his cello, I had to learn that all those cello lessons were not for me, but for him, and to help him fulfill God's plan for his life—not my plan for his life. After all, they are His children, not ours.

Today, Scott is getting ready to graduate from the police academy, but when he has been really stressed after a day at the academy, he will pull out his cello and play.

Jeremiah 29:11 promises that God has a plan for each of our lives—a plan for good, to give us a future and a hope. Claim that promise for your daughter and for you. Trust her and her gift to God, and enjoy the journey.

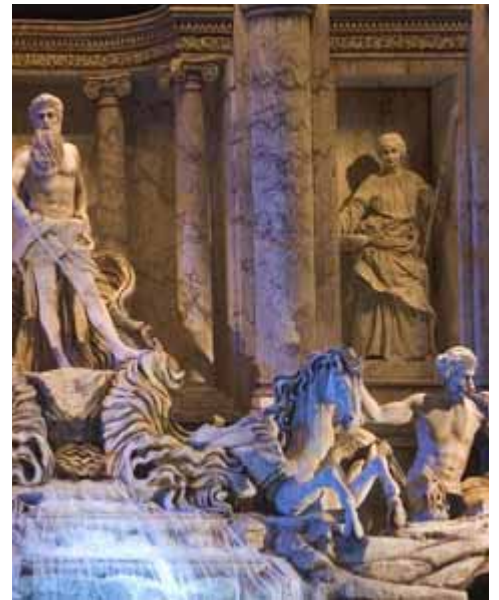

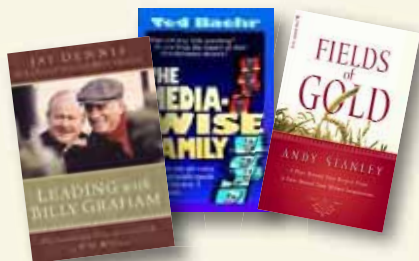

Within one month of burying my baby, my husband, whom I adored, hit the bars and never came home. I found myself broken and bitter. In those early days when people tried to comfort me, some would say, "You know, God is going to use this to help others some day." I would reply, bitterly (and yes, I meant it), "That's wonderful. I've prayed all my life I could be someone's bad example."

Who could know then, in the midst of my pain, that God was preparing me to lead the Divorce and Grief Recovery program for the Crystal Cathedral! And who could know then that it would be one of the most rewarding things I do? People walk into that room with the same pain on their faces I lived with for years, and they learn to laugh again. Only a good God could transform my bitterness into a song of praise and raise me to "comfort with the comfort wherein I have been comforted!" (II Corinthians 1:2-3).

Only a good God could transform my bitterness into a song of praise and raise me to "comfort with the comfort wherein I have been comforted!"

Who could know then that my little 2-year-old son Jeff would someday work for the Regional Center, the organization that gave me such hope during Justin's short lifetime? Today, Jeff helps other families with handicapped children.

In the aftermath of my loss, I couldn't buy a job. Teachers were in oversupply. I complained to God as I sought employment elsewhere, telling Him He was doing a pretty lousy job of meeting my needs. Who could imagine then that the job He would lead me to would become a nationally acclaimed staff development program, helping high-risk youth graduate from high school and go to college? Only a good God could transform my pain and complaining into hope for someone else!

The Bible teaches that God will "make up...for the years that the locusts have eaten" (Joel 2:25). It took years, but I managed to pay off the bills brought on by my e-husband's alcoholism, buy another home, travel all

es of worship synagogues. Most of the first believers of the faith in Christianity were Jewish people. They would come together, read from the scriptures, and then hear a sermon interpreting what had been read, encouraging the believers to be faithful to the Bible, the word of God. Then they would have prayer and, yes, they would have music, too.

Music is mentioned in the Psalms often, and many Psalms have been set to music. The Psalms mention songs, they mention dances, and they mention singing. Music – it has been a fundamental and very important part of the Church since the very beginning.

It is said that no movement succeeds without great music. Yet it's also music that presents one of the greatest challenges - and opportunities - in the Church today.

A few decades ago, young people began drifting in mass to a kind of music that didn't relate to some of the music that was traditional to the Church. Being so committed to classical music and the great hymns at the Crystal Cathedral, we didn't bring in a lot of drums or guitars, but kept with the more timeless use of violins, trumpets, pipe organ, etc. Though on many occasions we have brought in as music guests the best of the contemporary Christian music world.

The exciting news is that, because we are always seeking "to find a need and fill it," we have, over the course of the last few years, established other worship services at the Crystal Cathedral to meet the need of the younger people who haven't come from a classical church music background, but seek to worship in a more contemporary style. In the Cathedral on Sunday mornings, we will continue as classical, but at our other services - The Gathering, C3, Hispanic Ministry, and the Evening Service - the worship music is more contemporary.

My grandson Bobby Schuller, who will be ordained in a couple years once he completes seminary, and his wife Hannah have been called to lead The Gathering, a church service held every Sunday morning at 11:00 in the Arboretum. Their service presents an authentic yet contemporary style of music and worship, while their message is presented in an even more traditional way than ours is in the Crystal Cathedral classic service. I believe a big majority of our young people who've grown up in this church the past 50 years – as well as young people from our surrounding community - are searching for a church where they can hear the gospel sung in the kind of worship music found at Bobby and Hannah's services.

And last spring we began another church service in our Freed Theater called C3, aimed specifically at the parents of children attending Kid Power Plant. We sometimes feature their music in our classic Crystal Cathedral service, and they watch the live message and interview from our Crystal Cathedral via a video feed.

Our evening service presents worship in both the classical and contemporary styles, as does our Hispanic Ministry services.

So, this is a great, great ministry for people who have many different tastes.

What's happening today at this ministry, in the Crystal Cathedral and in other rooms of this place, is phenomenal. And I need your help and support to reach the young people that we need to reach. We believe that to give them the chance to hear Christian music to the rhythm and the momentum that they've been born and raised with in today's world, that's the right thing to do. To keep the Church alive, we have to respect and meet the needs of our young people.

We've got the message. So, if they come here, we will turn the cynics into seekers. We'll turn the seekers into believers. And we'll turn the believers into achievers! And that's the whole gospel, hallelujah, Amen.

ing Buddhist, recalled his stories about enjoying such activity in his earlier years. She thought he should return to his Protestant roots and that joining a choir might do the trick. One of Lisa's friends suggested the Crystal Cathedral, thus Jess' choir search was underway.

That morning, as he waited for the worship service to begin, Jess recalls, "I heard the sweet music of roller canaries harmonizing with the organ prelude. I was stunned. My grandmother, with whom I grew up, had raised canaries and their music filled our home. I felt as though Grandma was speaking to me. I realized that I had come to the right place. Following an audition, a vacancy occurred, and I was given a spot in the choir."

Jess came from a singing family. Since few cars had radios back in the early 1930s, his uncle, aunts, and grandparents all harmonized as they rode their cars on longer trips. By the 4th or 5th grade, Jess had become a regular member of the elementary school choir singing for the PTA and other school functions. Choir and drama also played a big part in his high school career as well.

Jess' grandmother consistently took him with her to the parish Catholic church when he was a little boy. She was a faithful Catholic member and he eventually became a member with her. However, something was going to happen to take him in another spiritual direction.

As a high school student, Jess decided to join the YMCA. He was always looking to better himself. Part of that program, he soon found out, was a week of summer camp in the San Gabriel Mountains. The daily schedule always included an evening Vesper Service. "The first night I attended," Jess said, "the spirit of God came down." Something powerful happened to him that night that redirected his life. As he told me about it, a half century later, the emotion came back to him and he tearfully talked about that special day.

After his "Born Again" experience, Jess started attending the Methodist Church, and he also stayed on with the YMCA in leadership positions. His grandmother blessed him in his spiritual growth and her influence has never completely left him. One thing she

spoke about often was her conviction of how the presence of the Holy Spirit guided our lives and of the existence of guardian angels to protect us.

His drive to better himself kicked in right after High School. Gradually he acquired a college education as he worked hard with Lockheed, Aerospace, General Dynamics, Pacific Architects, and The Ralph M. Parsons Co., always improving himself.

Much of Jess' career was overseas, including four years with The U.S. Navy. The Navy duty was during The Korean War, but Jess spent most of his time in Kwajalein, Marshall Islands, on the Admiral's staff. His wife and young children, who as adults now live in Hawaii, were with him but it was not a good time for the family and his marriage went into dissolution.

A decade later, Jess was a civilian industrial engineer stationed in Viet Nam. He was there for the entire six years of the war managing a variety of civilian projects. There, in Saigon, one of the employees working in his company was an attractive, articulate, Vietnamese Army widow and mother of two little girls. It was Lisa, now a real estate broker with Century 21, and Jess' wife.

But first, they had to get out of Viet Nam at a very difficult time. Lisa and daughters, Teri and Lynn, just barely made it out before the frenzied evacuation we saw on the TV news. Jess was in a safe place but, for a time, was passed over for a ticket to get on a plane. Eventually, an unexpected interview on CBS News highlighted him and he was able to leave five days before the complete fall of Viet Nam.

Today Mr. Tapia, who refers to himself as a Latin, devotes about 60 miles a week to serious biking. He regularly rides in the L.A. Marathon and a variety of Orange County cycling events as well. He has also become a licensed funeral director and works part time for Forest Lawn Cemetery and Mortuary in Cypress.

While arguably the most handsome man in our Cathedral Choir, Jess is a lot more than a good-looking face. He is a deeply spiritual person, a talented singer, a patriot, and a professional who has made our world stronger and safer. And today he carefully assists the brokenhearted as they say their farewells to loved ones. Jess is another treasure in our church family.

I realized that I had come to the right place. Following an audition, a vacancy occurred, and I was given a spot in the choir."

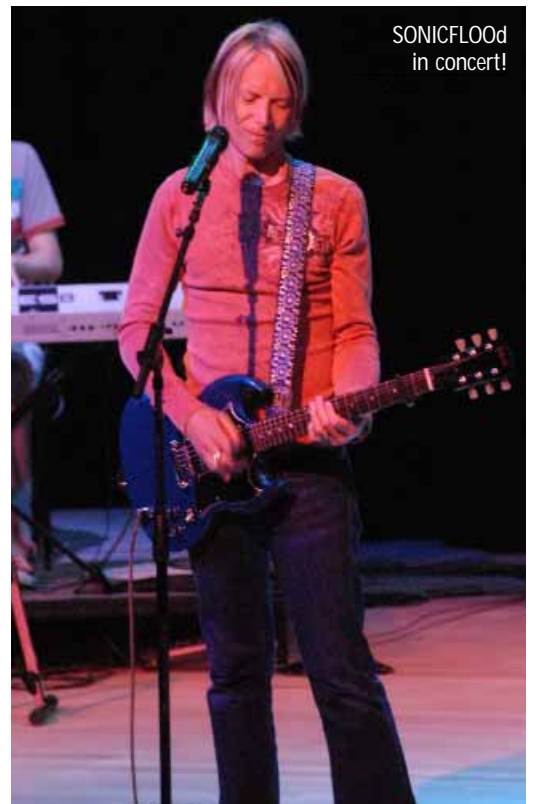

50 states with Jeff, and travel internationally through my work. On the whole, my life has been blessed.

A few years ago, when a charming widower walked into the Divorce and Grief Recovery program, I noticed him immediately, but I knew enough about grief to know he needed time to heal. He attended the 14-week program twice, over a period of one year. Then he became a facilitator, attempting to help others who were grieving, and we became friends. One evening he asked me to join him for coffee...and the rest, as they say, is history!

After over 20 years of being single, I married Milton Lockett. I don't know why it took God so long to prepare me for Milt, but he was worth waiting for. We have reached a place in life where we do not take life or love for granted. We cherish each day God grants us as husband and wife, and continue to work together in the divorce and grief recovery program.

Psychologists teach that the resolution of grief is sadness. It is sad that Jerry and I didn't make it. It is sad that Justin had to suffer and die. But it is also okay. Writing my books and crying a mountain of tears transformed Justin from my tragedy-on-earth into my treasure-in-Heaven.

And working through my grief over the divorce that followed transformed me from the victim-of-life to the victor-over-circumstances. Yes, it is sad, but life is good, but God is good, and marriage to Milt is wonderful. When God repaid to Job the years that the locusts had eaten, he didn't get back anything he lost, but God "blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning" (Job 42:12). I understand that now.

I wish for those who hear my story to find strength and courage for their own journey. More than that, I wish them God's peace, knowing that rain clouds come and go and that the sun will shine again.
