## FAMILY ADVICE

THE LOVING GIFT OF LETTING GO

*Q. My mother was recently diagnosed with Alzheimer's. As of now, she still remembers my siblings and me. At times she gets the names of our children mixed up. I am already finding myself grieving the loss of my mother. I feel so guilty about the time I lost with her in the past. I was so caught up in furthering my career that I neglected her. Now, I feel like it's too late. Can you help?*

*-Too little too late*

A. Although it doesn't feel like it right now, in truth you have been given a gift! You have an opportunity to make the most of these last years with your mother. There are two suggestions I will give you—the first is practical and the second is spiritual.

1. Capture her now while you still have time—take pictures, videotape, record, journal—get her to talk about her life as much as you can.

This project will provide a way for you to stay as connected with her as possible. In the process, you will provide a gift for your children and your children's children, and give her the gift of you while she still knows you and recognizes you.



2. Put her in God's hands—she is His child more than she is your mother. When my father was in the hospital in Amsterdam with a head injury that left him with no memory, my mother faced an uncertain future. She cried out to God. Suddenly, she looked out the hospital window and saw a sparrow sitting on the window ledge. Immediately she recalled the lyrics to an old hymn: "Why

should I feel discouraged...His eye is on the sparrow...and I know He watches me!"

Treasure the moments you have left with her, resting in the hope that she is in good hands—God's hands!

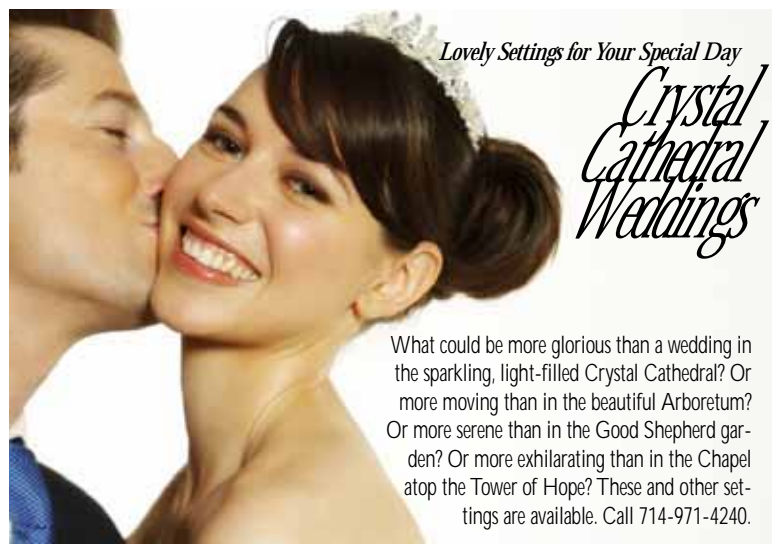

given to a Mobile Home park in Garden Grove where the majority of residents are in need of assistance with even the basic necessities.

- More than 250 pairs of shoes were donated to the welfare agencies in Garden Grove, Santa Ana, and the city of Orange.
- Eighteen 40-gal. bags of "gently used" clothing were given to several of the homeless facilities throughout the community.
- Five boxes of new clothes were given to agencies helping unemployed and destitute O.C. families.
- 150 cans of food and two large boxes of hygiene products were donated to the food banks and rescue missions.
- Shoes and new clothes were sent to an Aids shelter in Tijuana, Mexico.
- 500 lunches and over 200 breakfasts were provided to O.C. homeless shelters
- A lap-top computer was provided to Mathew's Kidz Club.
- A television, 30 cans of coffee, and 15 Bibles were sent to the L.A. Mission
- A bike was donated that will provide transportation for a Cactus Gardens resident in need.
- Two new volunteers were provided to Lampson School for their reading program.
- We hosted a breakfast for O.C. Habitat for Humanity.
- A young girl is being mentored to complete 45 hours of community service.
- ESL students volunteered for the World Vision Experience, "Step Into Africa."
- Gifts were provided for tutors and students in celebration of Epiphany.

not because of her desire for personal learning and encouragement or to make new friends, though those benefits are nice! She volunteered simply because she saw the need: lonely people, hurting or stressed, and with no one to talk to. And often they're in danger of giving up on God because He hasn't seemed to be helping.

She's happy being an "unsung hero" because she wants the thanks and praise to be sung to Jesus.

The limelight is not what Quiet Servant is looking for. Rewards and awards aren't her motivation. She wants the applause to go to Jesus. She has received God's

care in the past when she was in need and she simply wants to give something back and do this as expression of her love for the Lord. She's happy

being an "unsung hero" because she wants the thanks and praise to be sung to Jesus. She likes being anonymous, even using a pseudonym as a New Hope volunteer. Often she secretly comes and goes to fulfill her shift on the phones or the website. If nobody knows except the callers or chatters and the Lord, then that's fine.

Quiet Servant offers care, kindness, and prayers as a New Hope Counselor because somebody needs to do it! Why not her? When she commits to a shift she keeps it – you can count on her! She is faithful and reliable, a person of her word.

She's serving Christ and meeting a need. Jesus' words are true for her: "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).

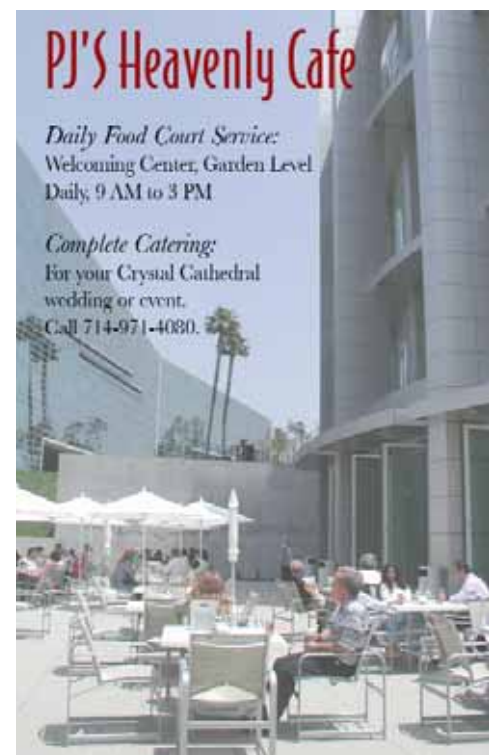
