

NEW HOPE

Carl Alvarez: Serving Helped Him Find Wholeness

Carl Alvarez, New Hope's Counselor of the Month for October, often thinks about a particular caller who a long time ago said, "Thank you!" When he feels that maybe he's too busy to continue volunteering as a New Hope Counselor at the Crystal Cathedral he remembers what this caller said after a very ordinary conversation. When he feels down and like maybe he's not making a difference he thinks back on this caller's words of appreciation: "You're doing a great service with a great organization. You've helped me and I'm sure you've helped many others – even if they didn't say so."

"I feel more whole than ever and New Hope has played a huge role in that!"

We all need to hear words of appreciation, to know that our life is contributing something positive to others. There was a time that Carl thought he'd never feel that joy. Like a number of our counselors, he came to New Hope in response to a personal tragedy. In 1984, when he was just 19 years old, his brother gave up his life through suicide. Carl was devastated. He was left with an overwhelming hole in his soul that wouldn't go away. For years he responded to the emptiness by saying that he wanted to volunteer on a crisis hotline, but it wasn't until 1997 that he put his words into action and joined New Hope. He's never looked back! He says, "I feel more whole than ever and New Hope has played a huge role in that!"

When I talk to our New Hope Counselors I always wonder, "What's their secret? Why do they give their time and their heart to care for strangers in pain?" For Carl it seems to be the opportunity to work with God to bring about something good from the horrible loss of his brother.

Every shift at New Hope Carl does this, but a

recent call stands out to illustrate the miracle of God's redemption. A 19-year old young woman called New Hope with thoughts of suicide. She was the same age as Carl's brother who completed suicide! A voice inside Carl's head (perhaps it was the Holy Spirit reminding him of his New Hope training?) said, "Listen to her. Don't react!" So, he listened to her as she shared about the things that were depressing her, like growing up in a troubled household. Then Carl simply reflected back to her his understanding of her state of being. He stepped inside her life without preaching and judging and simply offered compassion and by doing so he and the caller both found the serene place inside her tornado. She had new hope! She thanked Carl, saying that he had been the first person to really listen to her and had really encouraged her.

Another secret to Carl's success is that before his Wednesday night shift Carl prays to ask God to guide him with his words and responses to the callers. This helps him to get in touch with God's presence with him on the phones and to follow God's Spirit in his everyday life!

Carl lives in Huntington Beach with his wife and son and he works as a music products manager for Virgin Entertainment Group in Los Angeles. He was raised by his grandparents who live in Redlands, CA and he remains very close to them to this day.

Ken found it to be a classic old piece. So, he dismantled it, reassembled it, painted it to match the Ranch piano, and brought it to its new home. That, I think, is a unique form of kindness in action.

Sprinkle, Spill, and Spread a Little Kindness

There is a lot of good inside every person that never gets spread around. It just sits there. There is appreciation and admiration in everyone that never goes anywhere. Such thoughts and feelings can help many people if we just start sprinkling some of it on the people we meet.

The cashier at the supermarket, the bank, the car wash, needs a kind word and a smile. Everybody has that need inside him and most often we never give it to anyone. Loving-kindness is like spirit-nourishing vitamins. It will heal the cashier's hurts, fears and loneliness if it is poured on him. It only takes 20 seconds to plant a major gift in her heart—"I like your smile." Or, "You are a pleasant person." Or, "You are a good worker."

Such words, and a smile, plant Hope in another person's heart. They send the message that there is goodness and kindness in this world, not just meanness. There is love, not just selfishness. There is good, and if there is good, there must be God. Hope is born!

LIGHT ALWAYS OVERPOWERS THE DARK

Dear Sheila,

My husband and I have three young children. Recently, our three-year-old began waking at night crying. I've allowed her to sleep in our bed, but my husband thinks she'll outgrow her fear better by staying in her own bed. What can we do to help our daughter feel less fearful at night?

—Afraid of the Dark

Dear Afraid,

With four boys of our own, born within seven years, my husband and I would never have slept except for the comforters we set out on the floor around our bed. The boys knew that, if they became afraid in the night, they were welcome to come in (if the door was open) and plop down



on the floor next to our bed. Many mornings we struggled to get out of bed without stepping on a little boy sleeping peacefully on the floor. Eventually, all our boys outgrew their fear of the dark.

We also used these times to teach our boys spiritual lessons about darkness and light. For our family

devotions, I would take a suitcase and tell the boys it was filled with darkness. I'd ask them, "What do you think will happen if I open the suitcase? Will all the darkness spill out and make the room dark?" They would laugh and say, "Of course not, Mommy!" I would also take them into a dark closet, and turn on a small flashlight, amazing them with how such a tiny light could overpower the darkness.

Jesus said, "I am the light of the world." What a powerful lesson to teach our little ones, and it's a good reminder for us adults, too!





Grosch teaches all academic subjects with a focus on helping prisoners to pass a GED, so their chances of getting work in the outside world are increased and they don't return to jail. Grosch says the average reading level now in her facility is sixth grade, three grade levels higher than the national average.

"There is a never-ending need for all variety of paperback books and good magazines, such as *National Geographic*, *Discovery*, and cooking, sewing, and fashion periodicals. The most popular books would be from the New York Times bestseller list, romances, mysteries, and spiritual books. I would particularly like to have biographies and poetry books so that I might begin a focus group." She emphasizes that hardback books are not permitted due to their being repositories for illegal items, and inmates are not permitted anything that could be used as a weapon, not even pens, crayons, or markers.

Miss Lynn, as her students call her, uses the best donated books as prizes or incentives in spelling bees and written exams. The winners of these competitions are allowed to peruse the selections and make a choice, and it is a cause of great excitement in her classes.

When asked about her latest success story, the teacher spoke of "Stevie," a girl who ran away from home at 15 and became involved with a 37-year-old man. Because her mother did not come looking for her, the teenager felt abandoned and ran afoul of the law. Now released for three months, "Stevie" has reconnected with her mother and will soon pass her GED. "She has a positive attitude now and great plans for herself," smiled her instructor. "I think she will do well in the future."

Under the guidance of Dr. Beverly Muffin, Global Missions Director, Crystal Cathedral member Elayne Alexander and Community Missions Director Gudelia Ramirez will be collecting paperback books and magazines for inmates beginning October 7, Sundays on the Plaza, or you may

bring them directly to Tower of Hope, Floor 8. (Note: Be sure to tear off or ink out any identifying addresses on the publications mailed to you.) By donating positive books and magazines, only God knows the lives that will be changed by this simple, yet important, act of love.

food, prepared meals, and became acquainted with all 19 boys who live there. The generous donations from Crystal Cathedral members and friends allowed us to bring school supplies and backpacks for everyone.

The orphanage, supported solely by donations, meets the boy's basic needs for clothing, food, and housing. Plus, they provide the love and discipline the boys sorely need as they learn the difference between living on the streets, abandoned, neglected, and often abused, and living a life full of promise and hope. So hugs and encouragement, as well as chores and responsibility, are everyday occurrences at Rancho San Juan Bosco.

Gudelia, who drove the group down in an eight-passenger van, was not only our driver and guide, but also our translator and teacher. Gudelia's wisdom in leading the group became quite apparent when the meal I chose to prepare included potato salad. Though Gudelia cautioned me not to add the American cucumber sweet pickle relish to the salad, Alice and I decided it was a necessary

ingredient. Gudelia's cautioning words came back to haunt us as we watched with wrenched hearts nineteen young boys struggling to eat something that tasted horrible and strange. The next day, when Gudelia peeled and sliced over a 100 cucumbers, adding her secret Mexican ingredients, we were happy to see the boys eating and relishing every last bite! So, it wasn't cucumbers, but the spices that were different - what a learning curve.

After this important first trip to Rancho San Juan Bosco, we are committed, with our hearts seared in love, to these 19 amazing boys who desperately need our help. Gudelia will be organizing another trip over the Thanksgiving weekend in November. Please join us, or pray about how you can be of help and support. This article is long enough to share all the realities and the needs of Rancho San Juan Bosco. What the Orphanage Needs:

The Boy's Dormitory: Now in bad need of repair, the dormitory is in the slow process of being replaced by a new building. They are in need of construction help, a new septic system, plus closets, chairs, rugs, dressers, bookcases, and something inspiring to hang on the walls.

A Revived Garden: Because there is no gardener and no one to teach the boys gardening techniques, the fresh vegetable garden is currently quite bedraggled and not producing as much food as it otherwise could.

Groceries: Another church generally provides two week' worth of food each month, so support to provide the other half of the groceries needed is sought.

Utilities: The electric bill runs between \$1,100 and \$1,500 per month; though a new electric plant is being built with a promise that the bills will be lower, donations are needed now to keep up with the current utility costs.

says. After that she sensed the presence of God with her every day for 40 days, reassuring and loving her. "This convinced me I had some work to do for God," Pat says.

Pat went on to earn an M.S. in School Psychology and has recently retired from Chino Valley School District. Her son is one of the leading physicians in the Veterans Administration. Ole, her husband, a potent Harvard Business School graduate, and the Crystal Cathedral Business Manager in the '80s, was her partner through it all. Sad to say, Ole went to heaven in 1988 leaving Pat with a fresh life challenge."

Today Pat is a model "50+" citizen. She is active as a Ministering Elder, continually employed by her long-time school district, a good

friend, and an active Christian. Her story has been written up by Robert H. Schuller in his books *Be Happy You Are Loved* and in *You Can Be the Person You Want to Be*. But there is more to it, and Pat is presently finishing her personal account. She is telling her version of a life God saved in a remarkable way and the monumental effort she had to mobilize to become what God wanted her to be.

Pat still carries the scars, of course, but for every scar on her body there is a star in her crown for the exemplary effort, in the face of overwhelming difficulties, Pat exerted to recover and rebuild. Our tradition at the Crystal Cathedral is to lift up people, like Pat, who has "turned her scars into stars," thereby motivating and inspiring other struggling souls endeavoring to build new lives.

Your IRA: Make it a Gift to the Crystal Cathedral Congregation Endowment Fund

A new law allows people who are 70 ½ years and older to make a current gift of up to \$100,000 from a traditional or Roth IRA. Gifts made this way are not subject to income tax.

At 70 ½ years old, owners of IRAs must begin taking taxable distributions from their plans. (Remember that IRAs were never intended to avoid taxes, only to defer them.) At 70 ½, it is time to pay the piper. Many people will, therefore, find it more advantageous to use their IRAs to make charitable gifts, than to make gifts from other resources.

This opportunity applies only to gifts made during 2007. The transfer of the funds must be made directly by your plan administrator.

Please also consider naming the Crystal cathedral Congregation endowment fund as a beneficiary of a portion of the amount left in your IRA at the time of your death. Generally, it is better to leave IRA assets to charity and cash and stocks to family.


